


## Sub Sale

**PREVENT  
MOSQUITOES FROM  
BREEDING IN YOUR  
BACKYARD**



**Facts you should know:**

All mosquitoes need water to pass through their life stages. Adult flying mosquitoes can rest in grass, shrubbery or other foliage, but they never breed there.

Some mosquitoes lay their eggs in standing water where they hatch in a day or two. Other mosquitoes lay their eggs in old tires, tin cans and other such water-holding containers. The mosquitoes may remain

unhatched for weeks, months or until they are covered with water. The mosquito "wigglers" or larvae grow quickly and turn into "tumblers" or pupae. Then the skin of the tumbler opens and out climbs a hungry adult mosquito.

**CHECK YOUR AREA &  
IMPLEMENT THE**

1. Empty, drain, remove, cover or turn upside down things that can hold water. Throw out old tires, tin cans, bottles, jars, buckets, drums and other containers or keep them upside down so no water can enter them.
2. Empty any small plastic wading pools weekly. Store it indoors when not in use. Properly maintain your swimming pool and keep it covered so as not to collect water.
3. Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets. Don't let runoff water from your air conditioner collect in shady areas.
4. Repair faulty septic systems (Call the Atlantic County Division of Public Health at 645-5971 prior to any septic system repairs).
5. Change water and scrub vases holding flowers once a week - or grow cuttings in sand.
6. Scrub and change the water in bird baths weekly.
7. Empty and refill pets' water pans daily.
8. Discard old tires or store them indoors.
9. Don't dump grass clippings, branches or other items in storm drains or ditches.
10. Fill holes in trees with sand or mortar, or drain or spray them.

**Local Residents and Business Owners:**

In accordance with of NJDEP Tier A Municipal Storm-water General Permit, the Township has adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of storm-water runoff and pollutants on the environment. As part of our Local Public Education Program, the purpose of this letter is to highlight the requirements and environmental benefits of these Ordinances.

**Pet Waste:** This Ordinance requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.

**Litter:** This Ordinance states that it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. The purpose of the Ordinance is to prevent unsightly and unsanitary conditions and prevent litter from impacting waterways.

**Improper Disposal of Waste:** This Ordinance states that it is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designated for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose of the Ordinance is to prevent unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.

**Wildlife Feeding:** Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The

Township enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concerns regarding bacteria which is harmful to human and fish populations.

**Yard Waste:** Yard Waste is regulated via Ordinances which establish the area contracted for collection by the ACUA and the methods use for preparing leaves, brush and other yard waste for that collection. The purpose of the Ordinance is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.

**Illicit Connections:** This Ordinance makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the Municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than storm-water runoff or groundwater (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.

**Reuse Containers / Dumpsters:** All dumpsters and other refuse containers that are outdoors or exposed to storm-water must be covered at all times. The purpose of this legislation is to prohibit spilling, dumping, leaking or otherwise discharge of liquids, semi-solids or solids from the containers to the municipal storm sewer system.

**Storm Drain Inlet Retrofitting:**  
This Ordinance requires the retrofitting of existing storm drain inlets which are in direct contact with repaving, repairing, reconstruction, or resurfacing or alterations of facilities on private property to prevent the discharge of

Solids and floatables (such as plastic bottles, Cans, food wrappers and other litter) to the storm system operated by the municipality

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies can result in the destruction of fish, wildlife and habitats; threats to public health and the loss of recreational and aesthetic value.

We have enacted the above Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by storm-water from adversely impacting our waterways and the groundwater supplies. Do you have a 3 to 5 year old child? Are you noticing any problems in your child's development such as:

- Do medical reports reflect a condition that will impact your child's ability to progress in school?
- By age 4, is your child not talking in short sentences?
- Is your child's speech and/or language not understood by most of the people outside your family?
- Is your child unable to perform simple tasks or is your child developmentally delayed?

Help is available. To be eligible as a preschool child with a disability, your child must be 3 to 5 years old and qualify for the program on the basis of an approved state assessment conducted by the Child Study Team and found eligible. 

19. There's nothing wrong with playing right field.


